Class Title Quarter/Year Course # NOTE: While any 393 or 395 seminar may count towards the four INSIDE CONCENTRATION courses (Section A) OR the six additional OUTSIDE CONCENTRATION courses (Section B), a student must take a total of at least 12 different history courses (titles) to fulfill the major requirements. With the exception of those classes listed below, all of the classes applied to Sections A, B, and C above must originate in the History Department. **NOTE:** Up to *two* of the following courses can be used to satisfy the requirements of Section B and C, above: (a) History courses taught in other departments or programs by regular faculty members of the History Department (e.g., Gender & Sexuality Studies 230-0 when taught by history faculty); (b) African American Studies 212-1,-2*; Asian American Studies 214-0*, 216-0*, 304-0*; Classics 211-0, 212-0, 321-0; Economics 315-0 (dependent upon subject matter), 318-0, 323-1,-2, 324-0; Environmental Policy 309-0*, 340-0*(History 376-0); Gender & Sexuality Studies 324-0*; German 344-1,-2*, 349-0*; Global Health 309-0* (History 379-0); Latino/a Studies 218-0*; Legal Studies 305-0*, 318-1,-2*, 320-0*; Religious Studies 264-0, 265-0 *These courses are always cross-listed with a History course, usually of the same course number, e.g. History 212-1/AF AM ST 212-1. Combined classes may be taken for credit in one department only and may not be taken for repeat credit in the other department offering the course. It is recommended you enroll in the course on the History side to receive History credit. **NOTE:** Only one Chicago Field Studies course can count towards the major/minor. NOTE: WCAS does not permit double-counting between the History major and other "stand-alone" majors; doublecounting is only allowed in the case of an adjunct major and then only as prescribed by that adjunct major. The History major itself has no double-counting provision. Generally, there is no double-counting between majors and minors; see the WCAS website for the list of exceptions. Other schools in the university (Medill, McCormick, SoC) have their own doublecounting rules. Please review these rules as necessary.
